Organization of "Soy Mahakumbh"-Soybean National Mela (May 29-31, 2022)

The ICAR-Indian Institute of Soybean Research, Indore, Madhya Pradesh has jointly organized three-day "*Soya Mahakumbh*" at Devi Ahilya Vishwa Vidyalaya, Indore from 29th to 31st May, 2022 in collaboration with the **Society for Soybean Research & Development (SSRD)**, Indore, Solidaridad, Bhopal and SOPA, Indore, Madhya Pradesh.



The Chief Guest, Shri Kailash Chaudhary, Union Minister of State for Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare applauded the hard work and contributions of the farming community in the country's economy, especially, during the COVID-19 Pandemic period.
